- 1.7 Preglaucoma, unspecified, right eye.
- 1.8 Car passenger injured in collision with bus in a traffic accident.

- 2.2 This 78-year-old gentleman is seen for continued follow-up for *C. diff colitis*. Cultures of the organism have found this infection to be resistant to Flagyl. A new drug regimen will be started at this time. What is the correct diagnosis code assignment?
- 2.3 Mrs Lizelle is in her second trimester at 16 weeks and presents for a check-up. She is HIV positive. What are the diagnosis codes?
- 2.4 A patient is admitted to the hospital with acute diastolic heart failure due to hypertension with end stage renal disease (ESRD).
- 2.5 Mrs. Velma is diagnosed with Lethargy due to unintentional overdose of sleeping pills

3.1 A woman who is G1PO at 38 weeks with twin gestation. The delivery was complicated by nuchal cord, without compression, of fetus two. Both infants were live-born and healthy. What is the correct diagnosis code(s)?

- 3.2 A 24-year-old woman with a history of *Chlamydia* two years ago comes in requesting an IUD. Examination is normal but tested for *Chlamydia* and a pap smear is done. IUD was inserted with no problems noted.
- 3.3 This 46-year-old male, working on his own home improvement projects, fell from a ladder outside of his single-family home. After evaluation, it was determined that he had a non-displaced femoral neck fracture on the left side. At this time, no surgical intervention is planned. What diagnosis codes are assigned?
- 3.4 A routine follow up visit for a 29 year old Type II Diabetic patient in her 2nd trimester at 15 weeks of pregnancy. She administers insulin once per day.
