John claims the Local Authority cannot cancel the contract because the contract is administered in terms of administrative law. Advise John based on the Scoltz case, Scholtz v Cape Divisional Council 1987 (1) SA 68 (CPD), discuss both what was argued by Scholtz and the Court's decision. [10]
