(a) Identify the article of the Constitution which deals with the Right to Privacy in Namibia, and explain the difference between "fundamental" and "absolute" rights.

(b) Using appropriate examples in each case, analyse the six conditions under which this article of the Constitution permits interference with the privacy of a person's home, correspondence or communications. (20 marks)

Professional codes of ethics outline the behaviour expected of practitioners, their organisations and associations.

(i) Identify accurately (i.e. by section and sub-section) and explain the requirements of any four principles of the Code of Ethics for the Namibian media .

(ii) Give your interpretation of the following statement by Collins and O'Rourke (1994) that "unless a code has a disciplinary or penal function and unless the people who violate it are punished...it (the code) becomes a meaningless document".
