## Mozambique flood survivors mourn, with thousands still missing

## Survivors of Mozambique cyclone recount devastation

A devastated mother of a three-year-old boy recalls how he was ripped from her hands by rising flood water during cyclone Idai that hit eastern Mozambique more than a week ago. The inland Begaja community has received no relief due to their remote area.

Sara Francisco survived the devastating Cyclone Idai by climbing a rooftop with her two young daughters in her rural village of Buzi after most surrounding buildings were swept away by flooding. She was stuck at the rooftop for about 24 hours with no food, surviving on rain water while calling out for help with her children. Help eventually came when a villager passed by in a small canoe, which brought Fransico, 24, and her daughters to a camp for displaced persons in Beira, 50km northeast of Buzi. But her problems are not over as she still cannot find her missing family members.

The World Health Organisation has promised to provide 900 000 doses of cholera vaccines to check the outbreak. The number of reported cases in Beira alone has increased to 271 as of Tuesday.
