Question 2: The Thing Around Your Neck

(35marks)

Critically analyse how Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie addresses themes of displacement and identity in *The Thing Around Your Neck* (2008) in at least three stories from the collection. In your analyses consider the intersections of culture, gender, and power in shaping the characters' experiences.

Question 3: Songs of Lawino

(35marks)

Discuss how Okot p'Bitek uses contrast in *Songs of Lawino* (1966) to portray the conflict between African tradition and Westernization and analyse how the characters of Lawino and Ocol represent these cultural tensions.

Question 4: The Lie of the Land

(35 marks)

Examine the theme of displacement in *The Lie of the Land* (2017) by J.D. Utley. How do the characters' experiences of land, belonging, and identity reflect broader sociopolitical issues in postcolonial Africa?
