The government system is a parliamentary constitutional monarchy; the chief of state is the king, and the head of government is the prime minister. The Netherlands has a mixed economic system which includes a variety of private freedom, combined with centralized economic planning and government regulation. Over 170 million consumers (more than one-third of the population of the European Union) reside within a 300-mile radius of the Netherlands. The country is a key center within the global business network, with advanced infrastructure geared towards the transportation of goods, people, and data. Its core distribution points include Rotterdam, Europe’s largest port, and Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, the fourth largest airport in Europe for cargo. The country has capitalized on its location and advanced economy to become one of the top trading nations in the world. The United States and the Netherlands have a strong bilateral relationship, based on close historical, cultural, and commercial ties. The relationship dates back to the American Revolution and is one of the United States’ oldest, continuous bilateral relationships. 1.3 “History of the Kingdom of the Netherlands

1.3.1 History of the monarchy

¹⁴The first Kingdom – the Kingdom of Holland, with Napoleon’s brother Louis as its King – lasted only four years (1806-1810). Three years later, in 1813, the Netherlands regained its independence, and Prince Willem Frederik, son of the last stadholder Willem V, returned from exile and was proclaimed sovereign prince. The first constitution of the Netherlands as a monarchy dates from 1814.

1.3.2 King Willem I

In 1815 the Congress of Vienna decided that the northern and southern provinces should be united. Willem Frederik proclaimed himself King Willem I of the new Kingdom of the Netherlands. The southern provinces seceded in 1830, and with the signing of the Treaty of London in 1839 the Netherlands recognised the new, independent, Kingdom of Belgium.

1.3.3 King Willem III

Until 1839 Luxembourg too formed part of the Kingdom of the Netherlands. In that year it became a Grand Duchy, with the King of the Netherlands as its Grand Duke. This personal union came to an end in 1890. When King Willem III died that year, the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg passed to the head of the other branch of the House of Nassau, since his daughter Wilhelmina, as a female, had no right of succession.

1.3.4 Decolonisation

¹⁵Until after the Second World War, the Kingdom of the Netherlands also comprised a significant number of overseas territories: the Dutch East Indies in Asia, Suriname in South America and the Netherlands Antilles in the Caribbean. A process of decolonisation followed in the post-war period. In 1949 Queen Juliana signed the treaty transferring sovereignty over the former Dutch East Indies to the Republic of Indonesia, thus recognising Indonesia as an independent state. New Guinea remained in Dutch hands until 1962; in 1963 it was transferred to Indonesia by the United Nations.

1.3.5 Charter for the Kingdom of the Netherlands

On 15 December 1954, Queen Juliana signed the Charter for the Kingdom of the Netherlands, whereby Suriname and the Netherlands Antilles acquired the status of countries within the Kingdom, with autonomous powers over their own internal affairs. Since then 15 December has

been celebrated as Kingdom Day. In 1975 Suriname left the Kingdom, becoming an independent republic.

1.3.6 Caribbean part of the Kingdom

In 1986 Aruba, one of the six islands of the Netherlands Antilles, acquired separate status as a country within the Kingdom. On 10 October 2010 Curaçao and St Maarten likewise became separate countries, while the remaining three islands – Bonaire, St Eustatius and Saba – acquired the status of public bodies and now form part of the Dutch polity””¹⁶ (Royal House of the Netherlands, 2024, <https://www.royal-house.nl/topics/history-of-the-kingdom-of-the-netherlands/history-of-the-monarchy>). ¹⁷In the Netherlands a distinction is made between the Royal House and the royal family. The Membership of the Royal House Act determines who is a member of the Royal House.

1.4.1 Membership of the Royal House

The Membership of the Royal House Act determines who is a member of the Royal House, namely:

1. the monarch;
2. the former monarch;
3. legitimate descendants of King Willem I who are related to the monarch in the first or second degree of consanguinity and are eligible for succession to the throne;
4. the spouses of the above;
5. members of the royal family who are members of the Royal House on the basis of the transitional arrangement provided for by the Membership of the Royal House Act.

¹⁸Since 2002, the Membership of the Royal House Act has provided that the Royal House comprises the members of the royal family who are related to the monarch in the first or second degree of consanguinity and are eligible for succession to the throne. A monarch who has relinquished the throne is likewise a member of the Royal House, as are the spouses, widows and widowers of the members referred to above. Princess Margriet and her husband, Professor Pieter van Vollenhoven, retain their membership of the Royal House under the rules of the former Act (the third degree of consanguinity).

1.4.2 Current members of the Royal House

The Royal House currently has 10 members:

¹⁹Since King Willem-Alexander ascended the throne, Prince Maurits, Prince Bernhard and their wives and the children of Prince Constantijn and Princess Laurentien are no longer members of the Royal House. The three children of Prince Constantijn and Princess Laurentien are however still in line of succession as long as King Willem-Alexander is on the throne.

Members of the Royal House cease to be members if they:

- lose their Dutch nationality;
- are deprived of membership by royal decree;
- marry without the consent of Parliament.

Princess Irene, Princess Christina (1947-2019), Prince Friso, Prince Pieter-Christiaan and Prince Floris married without Parliament's consent and hence lost their membership of the Royal House.

1.5.1 “Position and role as head of state

²²Under the Constitution, the King, together with the ministers, makes up the government. The King represents the Kingdom of the Netherlands at home and abroad. Besides his formal duties, King Willem-Alexander works in the interests of the inhabitants of the Netherlands. As head of state, it is the King's task to unify, represent and encourage the people. The ministers, and not the monarch, are responsible for the acts of the government, and the ministers are accountable to Parliament for what he says and does. The ministers, who together make up the cabinet, are responsible for decision-making. The King has weekly meetings with the prime minister, speaks regularly with ministers and state secretaries, signs all new Acts of Parliament and royal decrees and ratifies (as part of the government) international treaties. At the State Opening of Parliament on the third Tuesday in September, he delivers the Speech from the Throne, in which the government announces its plans for the coming parliamentary year. The Constitution requires that the monarch appoint, dismiss and swear in all government ministers and state secretaries. In view of this constitutional role, and at the request of the House, the King can be kept apprised of all developments in [the formation process](#). The monarch is officially the president of the Council of State, a historical role which is purely symbolic in nature. The Council of State provides the government and Parliament with independent advice on legislation and governance and is also the country's highest administrative court. In addition to the plenary meetings attended by the King, the Council of State also consists of an Administrative Jurisdiction Division and an Advisory Division, whose meetings the King does not attend. Accordingly, the King is not involved in practice in the Council's two main areas of activity. The vice president is in charge of the day-to-day management of the Council of State and presides over its meetings. The King represents the Kingdom of the Netherlands at home and abroad. Besides his formal duties, the King works in the interests of the inhabitants of the Kingdom. As head of state, it is the King's

1.5.3.1 Military service

The King performed his military service in the Royal Netherlands Navy from August 1985 to January 1987. He received training at the Royal Netherlands Naval College in Den Helder, after

which he served on board the frigates HNLMS Tromp and HNLMS Abraham Crijnssen. In 1988 he received refresher training, serving as a duty officer on board the frigate HNLMS Van Kinsbergen.

1.5.3.2 Leiden University

After completing his military service in 1987, the King enrolled as a history student in the Arts Faculty of Leiden University. His studies gave him a wide-ranging knowledge of a broad spectrum of subjects, including general and Dutch history, economic history, political science and constitutional law, EC law, international law, human rights and economics. He was awarded a degree in history in 1993. The King concluded his studies with a dissertation on the Dutch response to France's decision under President de Gaulle to leave NATO's integrated command structure. While he was at university, he was a member of the Minerva students' society.

1.5.3.3 Royal Netherlands Air Force

After graduating in 1993, King Willem-Alexander gained his Military Pilot's Licence with 334 Transport Squadron of the Royal Netherlands Air Force. In 1994 the King spent several months at the Netherlands Defence College, studying aspects of the work of the Royal Netherlands Army and Air Force.

1.5.3.4 Preparing to be King

After his studies and his military career, the King completed an intensive programme in which he became familiar with every facet of Dutch society.²⁶ He studied the constitutional and legal systems and learned how central government and other authorities function. He visited European institutions, Dutch ministries and the High Councils of State. In 2019 she moved to Huis ten Bosch Palace in The Hague together with her parents, King Willem-Alexander and Queen Máxima, and her two sisters, Princess Alexia and Princess Ariane. Since September 2022 the Princess has been living and studying in Amsterdam. In her free time she enjoys horse riding, tennis and singing.

1.7.2 Education
